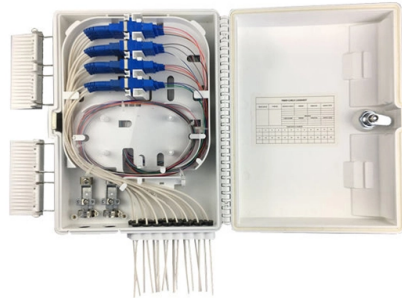


Compensation for Land Occupation by Telecommunication Fiber Cables

A Wayleave payment is made by electricity network companies, BT and Openreach when they have some of their equipment on or impacting your land. This. Pursuant to case law and the new Telecommunications Act, the telecommunications operators and the electricity grid operator are jointly and severally liable for the compensation payment to the property owner. If a communications network provider needs to use another. This power is known by a variety of names depending on a country's legal traditions, including eminent domain. A wayleave agreement lets a utility or telecom company enter your land to install, operate, and maintain equipment, such as cables or pipes. This agreement is usually temporary and can be ended or renewed.
