Quick answer: Bend-insensitive fiber (ITU-T G. 657) is singlemode fiber that maintains low loss when bent to radii as tight as 5-7. A2 as the default for FTTH drop cables, indoor patch cords, and MDU wiring. When stressed by bending, light in the outer part of the core is no longer guided in the core of the fiber so some is lost, coupled from the core into the cladding, creating a higher loss in the stressed section of the fiber.
