

Height of Exposed Electrical Box



Overview

The standard height of an electrical box on the floor (wall receptacle) is typically 12 to 16 inches from the finished floor to the center of the box. 0 meters) above the floor or working platform. This measurement ensures the panel remains readily accessible to all users. The International Standards of Practice for Inspecting Commercial Properties (ComSOP) states that the inspector should report on the lack of accessibility or working space for electrical panels and gear that would hamper their safe operation, maintenance, and inspection. NEC Article 408 covers switchboards, switchgear, and Panelboards installation and applications. 26 (A) (1) adds two more spacing categories beyond the Condition 1 – 3 ft residential baseline. Condition 2: Exposed live parts on one side and grounded parts on the other.
