Restricted Aisle Length: If one end of the aisle is closed off or lacks a personnel exit, the maximum aisle length should be limited to 6 meters for safe access and evacuation. Hot. A cold aisle that is less than the rack depth means you cannot replace racks at end of equipment life, and may not be able to service IT depending on the depth of the server trays. things to keep in mind when setting cold aisle depths. It is important to space these rows carefully, so that the width of the cold aisle is sufficient to deliver the required volume of air for all the racks it serves, and the width of the hot aisle is sufficient to prevent racks with higher powered servers from interfering with the exhaust airflow. Small server rooms often run 3 to 6 kW per rack, but anything above 8 kW usually needs containment. Next, evaluate the room envelope and clearance. Measure length, width, and height, including obstructions like pillars. Electrical panels must have at least 36 inches of clearance according to NEC.
