

Should armored cables be placed in cable trays



Overview

Due to their exposure to the open air because of the cable trays, the wires contained within need a very durable outer covering. The regulations dictate that the cables must either be Type TC (also known as Tray Rated) or must be metal-armored (Type MC). Cable trays are a support system for electrical cables, power, signal, and communication and optical fiber cables. However according to IEC 60079-14 in certain location you may use armored cables.
