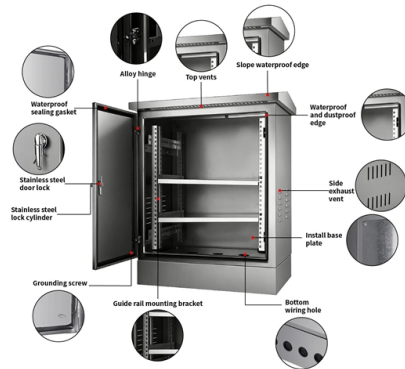


Spacing of gas pipe cable trays



Overview

All sizes above are measured from the outer edge of the services. Cables within cable trays can be bundled together into a maximum 100mm diameter bundle and each bundle should be spaced 50mm apart from each outer edge. Cable trays and pipes serve as the backbone of electrical and fluid transportation systems in both residential and industrial environments. A rung spacing of 6 to 9 inches (150 to 230 mm) is preferable when the cable tray cont d for instrumentation and control applications that require. The purpose of this industry bulletin is to remind building practitioners of their responsibilities to comply with minimum separation distances specified in the relevant Australian Standards when installing multiple services such as water, gas and electrical services in close proximity to each. As per the NEC, the maximum allowable rung spacing is 9 inches (230 mm) when cable tray carries sin-gle-conductor cables of 1/0 to 4/0 AWG (American Wire Gauge) (Appendix I).
